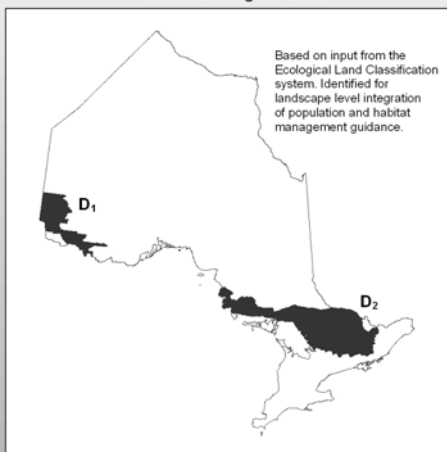

### Cervid Ecological Sub-Zone

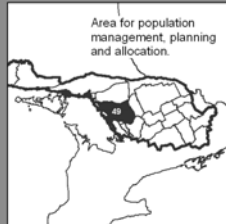

### Ontario's Ecological Land Classification

Defines ecological units to provide a policy basis and hierarchical system to inform ecosystem-based strategic planning at the landscape level - composed of three scales: eozones, ecoregions, and ecodistricts.  
(Crins 2002, Crins et al. 2009)

### Land Use Planning

Land use planning may delineate cervid habitat considerations and approaches (e.g. Crown Land Use plans, proposed land use plans for the far north, municipal land use plans, Endangered Species Act, 2007).

### Parks & Conservation Reserves

Ontario's network of parks and conservation reserves contribute to cervid population and habitat management across the province.
