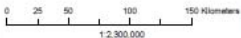

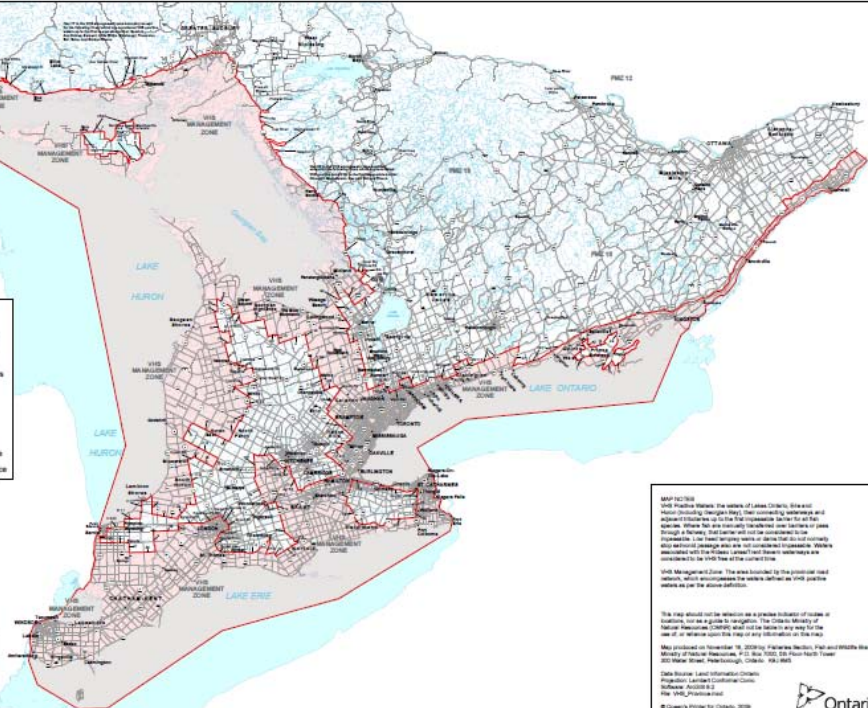

MAP NOTES
 VHS Invasive Waters: the waters of Lakes Ontario, St. Lawrence (including Georgian Bay), their connecting waterways and adjacent tributaries up to the first cusped barrier for all fish species. Waters that are usually transferred over barriers or passes through a barrier, that barrier will not be considered to be Invasive. Low flow temporary waters or dams that do not contain any non-indigenous species are not considered Invasive. Waters associated with the Rideau Canal that drain into waters are considered to be VHS free at the current time.

VHS Management Zone: The area bounded by the provincial road network, which encompasses the waters defined as VHS positive waters as per the above definition.
