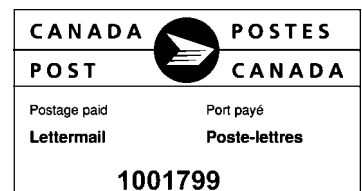

Amending O. Reg. 419/05

(Air Pollution — Local Air Quality)

Note: Ontario Regulation 419/05 has not previously been amended.

1. (1) Subsection 4 (2) of Ontario Regulation 419/05 is amended by striking out “or” at the end of clause (b) and by adding the following clause:

(b.1) the persons responsible for the sources of contaminant are required to prepare a report to which subsection 22 (1.1) applies, the Director has reasonable grounds to believe that a contravention of section 19 may occur as a result of discharges of a contaminant from the different sources of contaminant if section 19 applies and the properties are deemed to be a single property, and the Director has given written notice of that belief to the persons responsible for the sources of contaminant; or

(2) Clause 4 (2) (c) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “a report to which subsection 23 (3), 24 (2), 30 (5) or 32 (16) applies” and substituting “a report to which subsection 22 (1.2), 23 (3), 24 (2), 30 (5) or 32 (16) applies”.

(3) Section 4 of the Regulation is amended by adding the following subsections:

(2.1) Subject to subsection (2.2), clause (2) (a) does not begin to apply until 60 days after the Director receives the notice referred to in that clause.

(2.2) Clause (2) (a) does not apply if the Director has reasonable grounds to believe that an adverse effect may occur if one or more of the properties are excluded from the single property and gives written notice of that belief to the persons responsible for the sources of contaminant.

(2.3) The Director shall not give a person a notice under subsection (2.2) unless the Director first gives the person a draft of the notice and an opportunity to make written submissions to the Director during the period that ends 30 days after the draft is given.

1. The title to Regulation 581 of the Revised Regulations of Ontario, 1990 is revoked and the following substituted:

ACCESSIBLE PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

2. Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Regulation are revoked and the following substituted:

1. In this Regulation,

“person with a disability” means an individual,

- (a) who cannot walk without the assistance of another individual or of a brace, cane, crutch, lower limb prosthetic device or similar assistive device or who requires the assistance of a wheelchair,
- (b) who suffers from lung disease to such an extent that his or her forced expiratory volume in one second is less than one litre,
- (c) for whom portable oxygen is a medical necessity,
- (d) who suffers from cardiovascular disease to such an extent that the individual’s functional capacity is classified as Class III or Class IV according to Nomenclature and Criteria for Diagnosis of Diseases of the Heart and Great Vessels, ninth edition, published by Little, Brown & Co. in 1994,
- (e) whose ability to walk is severely limited due to an arthritic, neurological, musculoskeletal or orthopaedic condition,
- (f) whose visual acuity is 20/200 or poorer in the better eye, with corrective lenses if required, or whose maximum field of vision using both eyes has a diameter of 20 degrees or less, or
- (g) whose mobility is severely limited by one or more conditions or functional impairments;

“registered nurse in the extended class” means a member of the College of Nurses of Ontario who is a registered nurse holding an extended certificate of registration under the *Nursing Act, 1991*;

“regulated health practitioner” means a person legally qualified to practise in Canada as a physician, chiropractor, occupational therapist, physiotherapist or registered nurse in the extended class;

“traveller permit” means a disabled person parking permit for use related to travel issued under subsection 2 (4) to an individual holding an unexpired disabled person parking permit for general use issued under subsection 2 (1).

2. (1) The Minister shall issue a disabled person parking permit to every individual who applies for it on a form provided by the Ministry, if a regulated health practitioner certifies the following on the form:

1. That the applicant is a person with a disability.
2. The nature of the disability.
3. Whether the disability is temporary or permanent or whether this fact is unknown.
4. If the disability is temporary, the anticipated length of time the disability is expected to continue, if known.

(2) If, after January 16, 2006, a regulated health practitioner certifies on an application for a disabled person parking permit that the applicant is a person with a permanent disability, no certification from a regulated health practitioner is required on any application for renewal of that permit, despite subsection (1).

(3) If an individual holds an unexpired disabled person parking permit for general use issued under subsection (1), the Minister shall not issue another disabled person parking permit for general use to the individual under subsection (1).

(4) The Minister shall issue a disabled person parking permit for use related to travel to every individual who applies for it and holds an unexpired disabled person parking permit for general use issued under subsection (1).

(5) Every disabled person parking permit for use related to travel issued under subsection (4) shall specify the locations or circumstances in which it may be used.

(6) The Minister shall issue disabled person parking permits,

- (a) to a corporation, in respect of the number of vehicles that are owned or leased by the corporation primarily to provide transportation services to persons with a disability; and
- (b) to an organization, in respect of the number of vehicles that are owned or leased by the organization and used on a non-profit basis to provide transportation services to persons with a disability.

3. The Minister shall issue a disabled person parking permit to a visitor to Ontario, if the visitor,

- (a) provides evidence that he or she is the holder of a currently valid permit, number plate or other marker or device bearing the international symbol of access for persons with a disability issued by the visitor’s home jurisdiction; or
- (b) provides other evidence that he or she is from another jurisdiction and is a person with a disability.

3. Sections 5, 6, 7 and 8 of the Regulation are revoked and the following substituted:

5. (1) A disabled person parking permit issued to an individual shall be issued,

- (a) if the regulated health practitioner certifies that the disability is permanent, for 60 months;
- (b) if the regulated health practitioner certifies that the disability is temporary and specifies the anticipated length of time the disability is expected to continue, for the anticipated length of time the disability is expected to continue, up to a maximum of 24 months;
- (c) if the regulated health practitioner certifies that it is not possible to determine whether the disability is temporary or permanent, or if the regulated health practitioner certifies that the disability is temporary but of unknown duration, for 60 months;
- (d) if the individual is a visitor described in section 3, for the length of the visit, up to a maximum of six months; and
- (e) if it is a traveller permit, for the lesser of 12 months and the period ending on the date of expiry of the individual’s disabled person parking permit for general use.

(2) A disabled person parking permit issued to a corporation under clause 2 (6) (a) shall be issued for a term that reflects the contractual or other obligations of the corporation to provide transportation services to persons with a disability, up to a maximum of 60 months.

(3) A disabled person parking permit issued to an organization under clause 2 (6) (b) shall be issued for the length of time that the organization anticipates that it will be providing transportation services to persons with a disability, up to a maximum of 60 months.

6. (1) A disabled person parking permit ceases to be in force if the holder of the permit ceases to be a person with a disability.

- (2) A disabled person parking permit issued to an individual is not valid when it is displayed on a vehicle and,
- (a) the vehicle is not being used to pick up or transport the holder of the permit; or
- (b) the disabled person parking permit is a traveller permit and is being used in locations or circumstances not specified on the permit.

(3) A disabled person parking permit issued to a corporation or an organization is not valid when it is displayed on a vehicle and the vehicle is not being used to pick up or transport a person with a disability.

7. A disabled person parking permit shall be displayed on the sun visor or on the dashboard of a vehicle so that the international symbol of access for persons with a disability, the permit number and the expiry date of the permit are clearly visible from the outside of the vehicle.

8. A vehicle displaying a currently valid permit, number plate or other marker or device bearing the international symbol of access for persons with a disability and issued by another jurisdiction is entitled to the same privileges as a vehicle displaying a disabled person parking permit issued under the Act.

4. Clause 9 (a) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:

- (a) the holder is no longer a person with a disability;

5. Section 11 of the Regulation is amended by striking out the portion before clause (a) and substituting the following:

11. A parking space designated on Crown land or under a municipal by-law for the use of persons with a disability shall be distinctly indicated by erecting a disabled person parking permit sign which shall,

“studded tire” means a tire that has a tread embedded with devices that project beyond the tread and have a hardness of greater than seven on the Mohs scale;

“TSMI” means the Tire Stud Manufacturing Institute.

9. (1) No person shall operate a vehicle equipped with studded tires on a highway unless all of the following conditions are met:

1. The vehicle is operated during the period starting on October 1 and ending on April 30.
2. The permit holder of the vehicle is,
 - i. a resident of Northern Ontario,
 - ii. a corporation with a business premise in Northern Ontario, as shown by the address on the plate portion of the vehicle permit,
 - iii. a municipal corporation having jurisdiction and control of a highway or portion of a highway located in Northern Ontario,
 - iv. a road authority having jurisdiction and control of a highway or portion of a highway located in Northern Ontario,
 - v. a district school board in Northern Ontario,
 - vi. a school authority in Northern Ontario,
 - vii. Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario, or
 - viii. not a resident of Ontario and the vehicle is in Ontario for no longer than 30 days.
3. In the case of a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating equal to or less than 3,500 kilograms, all vehicle wheels are equipped with studded tires.
4. In the case of a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating greater than 3,500 kilograms, studded tires are either on all vehicle wheels or on only the vehicle wheels on one axle, and the vehicle is,
 - i. an ambulance, police vehicle or fire department vehicle,
 - ii. a school bus,
 - iii. a public utility emergency vehicle, or
 - iv. a road service vehicle as defined in section 133 of the Act.
5. The studs meet the specifications listed in paragraph i or ii as follows:
 - i. The studs,
 - A. are evenly embedded during tread manufacture,
 - B. do not protrude more than 2.0 millimetres,
 - C. have an aggregate object exposed surface area of 3 per cent of the tread surface area or less, and
 - D. have an exposed surface area variability between tires of the same size of no greater than 25 per cent.
 - ii. The studs,
 - A. are securely and safely embedded after tread manufacture in pin-holes moulded in any part of the tread other than the middle one-third,
 - B. are inserted in a tire that after manufacturing or remoulding has never been driven on a vehicle,
 - C. have only one peak per stud and no hollow part, and
 - D. meet the stud specifications applicable to the gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicle on which the studded tires are mounted, as set out in the Table.

DESIGNATION OF BUS BY-PASS SHOULDERS ON KING'S HIGHWAY

Designation of bus by-pass shoulders

1. (1) Those parts of the King's Highway described in Schedule 1 are designated as having paved shoulders for use by a bus operated in accordance with a licence issued under the *Public Vehicles Act* and an authorization provided by the Ministry by,

- (a) the Greater Toronto Transit Authority, also known as GO Transit; or
 - (b) Mississauga Transit.
- (2) A paved shoulder on a part of the King's Highway designated under subsection (1) may also be used by,
- (a) an emergency vehicle, as defined in section 144 of the Act, being operated by a person in the performance of his or her duties;
 - (b) a vehicle being operated by a police officer in the lawful performance of his or her duties;
 - (c) a vehicle owned or leased by the Crown in right of Ontario being operated, in the lawful performance of his or her duties, by an officer appointed for enforcing and carrying out the provisions of the Act; and
 - (d) a road service vehicle actively engaged in road construction or maintenance activities on or near the paved shoulder.

(3) No person shall operate or stop a motor vehicle on a paved shoulder of a part of the King's Highway designated under subsection (1) except as described in clause (1) (a) or (b) or clause (2) (a), (b), (c) or (d).

(4) Subsection (3) does not apply where it is impossible to avoid a temporary contravention of it due to,

- (a) an emergency; or
- (b) a vehicle being disabled while on a highway.

Signs marking bus by-pass shoulders

2. (1) A paved shoulder on a part of the King's Highway designated under section 1 shall be marked with the following ground mounted signs:

- 1. A sign that has the dimensions and bears the markings illustrated in Figure 1.
- 2. In an area designated in the Schedule to the *French Language Services Act*, a sign that has the dimensions and bears the markings illustrated in Figure 2, in addition to a sign described in paragraph 1.

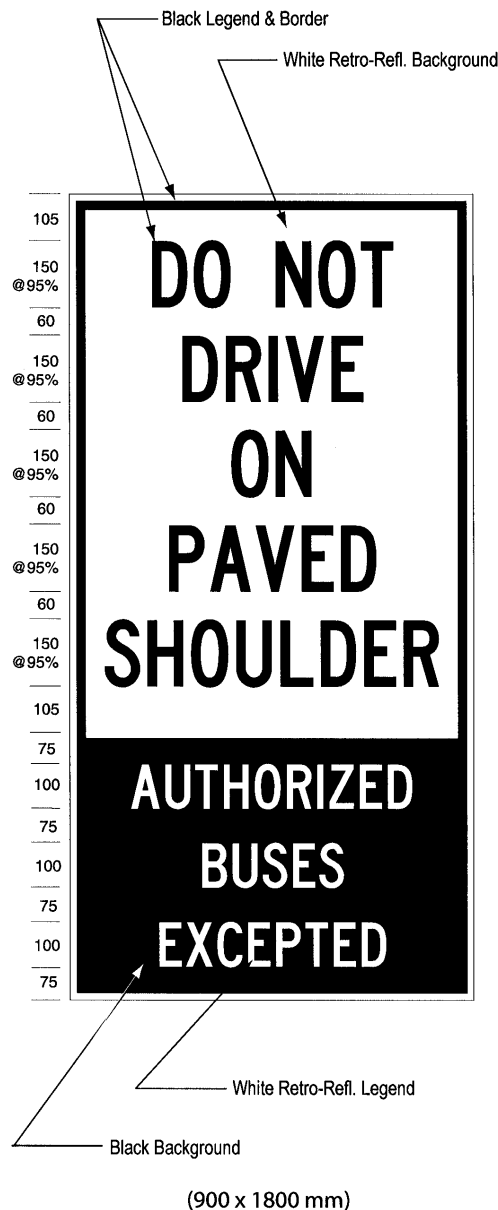
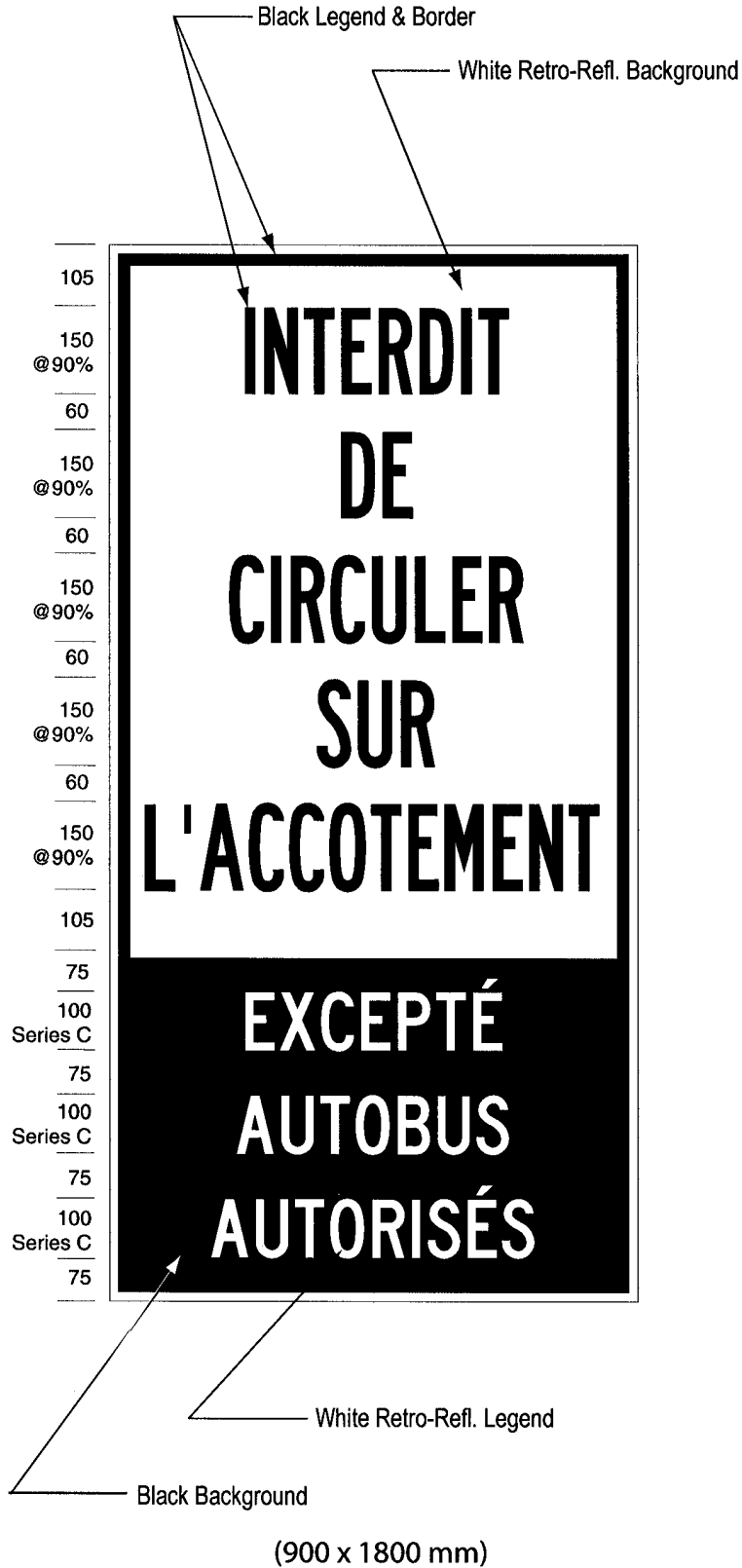

(2) The commencement of a paved shoulder on a part of the King's Highway designated under section 1 shall be marked with the following ground mounted signs:

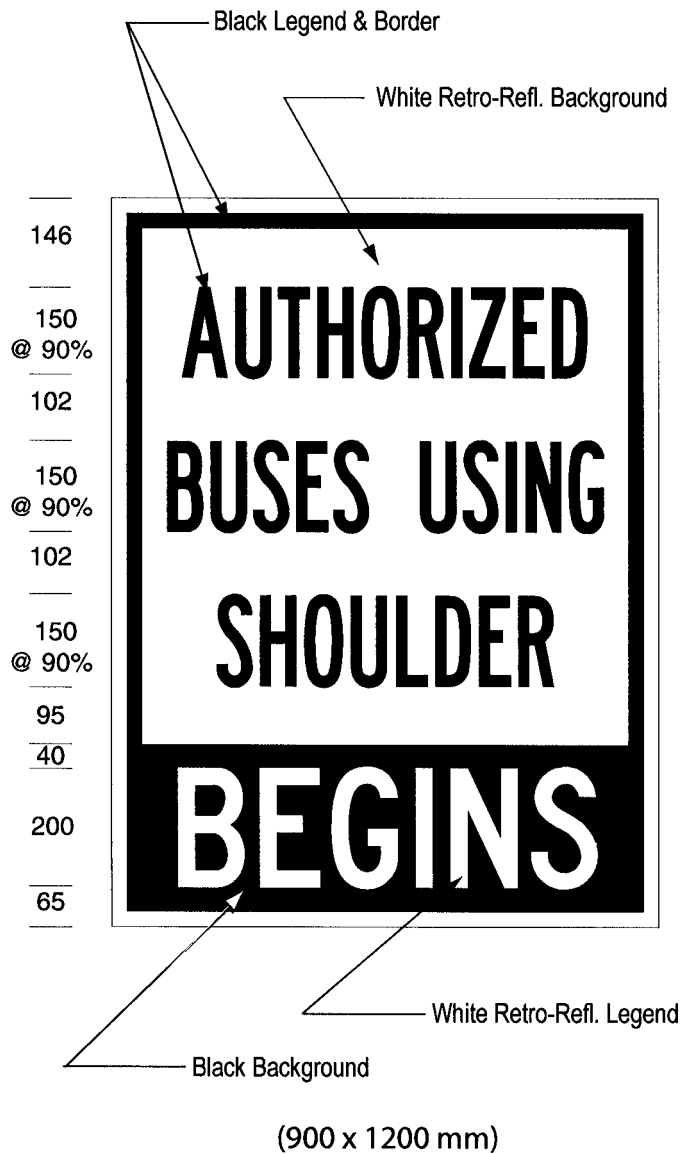
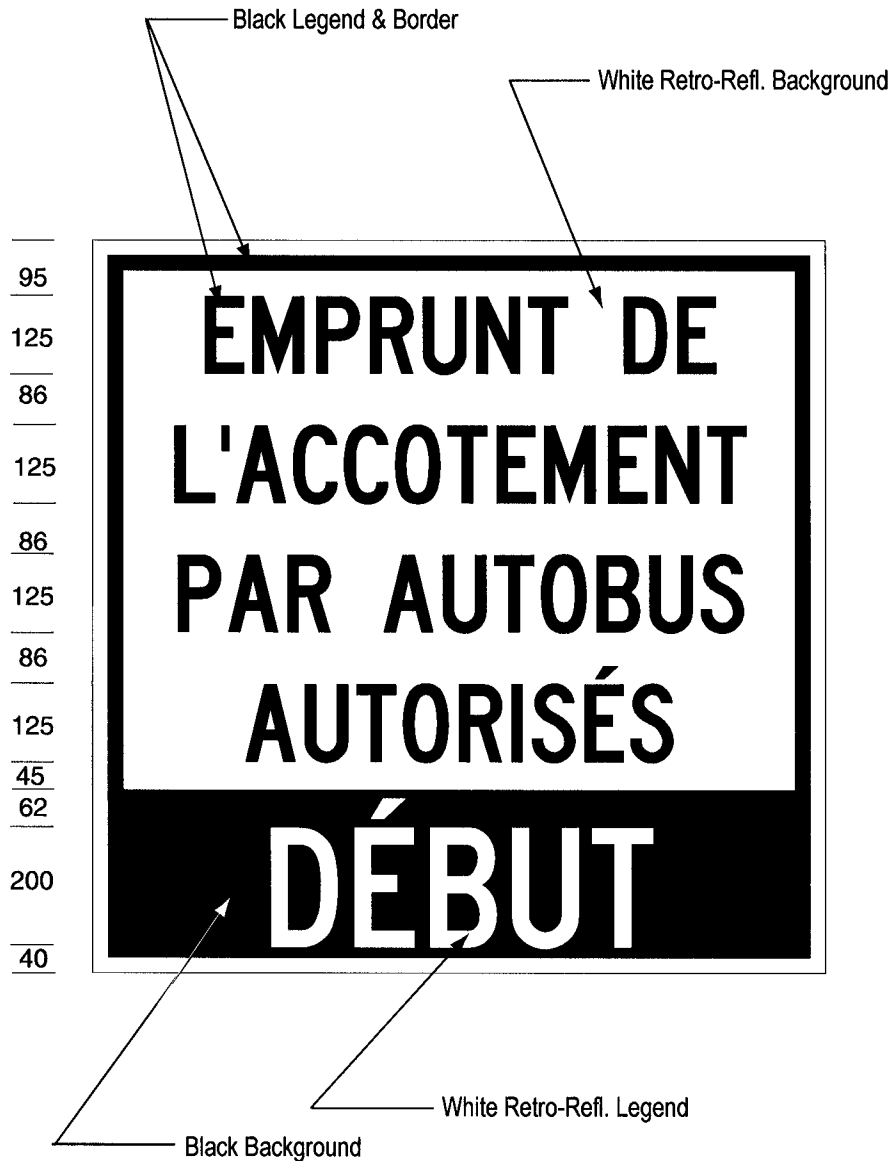

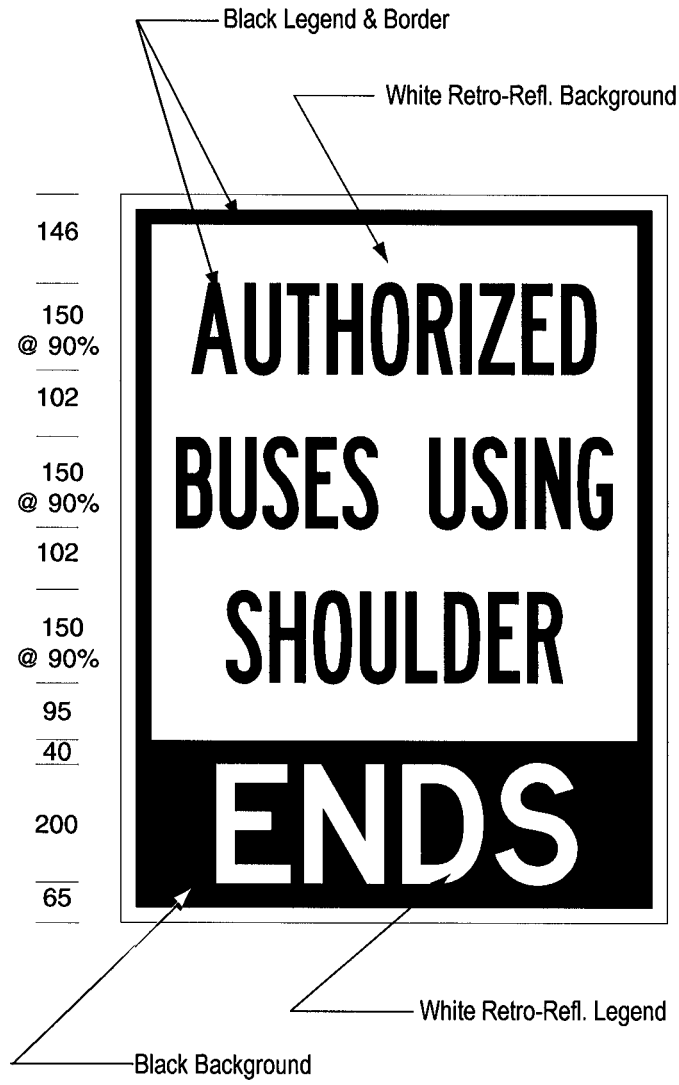

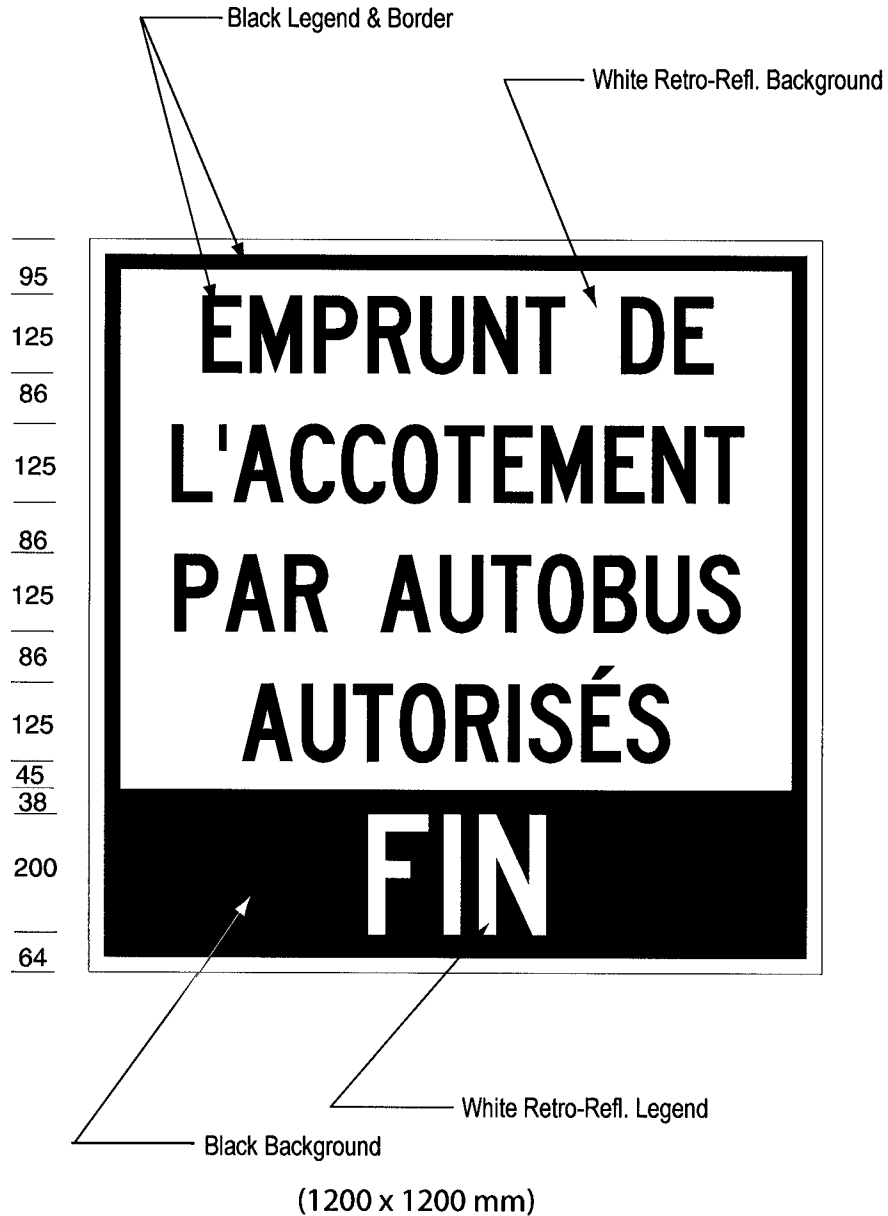

(4) The dimensions of a sign may be greater than the dimensions prescribed in subsection (1), (2) or (3) so long as each dimension is increased and, when increased, has the same relation to the other dimensions of the sign as the prescribed dimensions have to each other.

(5) A ground mounted sign shall be erected on the side of the highway facing approaching traffic.

Revocation

3. Regulation 580 of the Revised Regulations of Ontario, 1990 is revoked.

Commencement

4. This Regulation comes into force on the later of December 1, 2005 and the day this Regulation is filed.

1. (1) Subsection 1 (1) of Regulation 608 of the Revised Regulations of Ontario, 1990 is amended by inserting “or, where the left lane has been designated as a high occupancy vehicle lane, in the lane adjacent to the high occupancy vehicle lane” after “in the left lane”.

(2) Subsection 1 (2) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “left”.

2. (1) Subsection 2 (1) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “the left lane” and substituting “a lane”.

(2) Subsection 2 (1.1) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “the left lane” and substituting “a lane”.

(3) Subsection 2 (2) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “left”.

3. (1) Subsection 3 (1) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “the left lane” and substituting “a lane”.

(2) Subsection 3 (1.1) of the Regulation is amended by striking out “the left lane” and substituting “a lane”.

HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLE LANES

Designation of high occupancy vehicle lanes

1. The left lane of the part of the King's Highway described in a schedule to this Regulation is designated as a high occupancy vehicle lane for the hours, days and months specified in the schedule.

Use of high occupancy vehicle lanes

2. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle in a high occupancy vehicle lane unless one of the following circumstances exists:

1. In the case of a motor vehicle, the vehicle has at least two persons occupying seating positions.
2. In the case of a commercial motor vehicle,
 - i. the vehicle has at least two persons occupying seating positions, and
 - ii. the length of the vehicle or the total length of the vehicle and any vehicle being towed is less than 6.5 metres.
3. The vehicle is a bus.
4. The person is operating an emergency vehicle, as defined in section 144 of the Act, in the performance of his or her duties.
5. The person is operating the vehicle in the lawful performance of his or her duties as a police officer.
6. The person is operating a vehicle owned or leased by the Province of Ontario in the lawful performance of his or her duties as an officer appointed for carrying out the provisions of the Act.
7. The person is operating a vehicle engaged in road construction or maintenance activities in or near the high occupancy vehicle lane.
8. The person is operating a tow truck that has been requested to provide towing or repair services to a disabled vehicle in or near a high occupancy vehicle lane by a police officer, an officer appointed for carrying out the provisions of the Act, or a person driving the disabled vehicle, and operating the tow truck in the high occupancy vehicle lane is necessary to attend at and depart from the location of the disabled vehicle.

Buffer zones

3. (1) Entry and exit points at which vehicles may enter or exit high occupancy vehicle lanes are located between buffer zones, illustrated in Figure A in section 4.

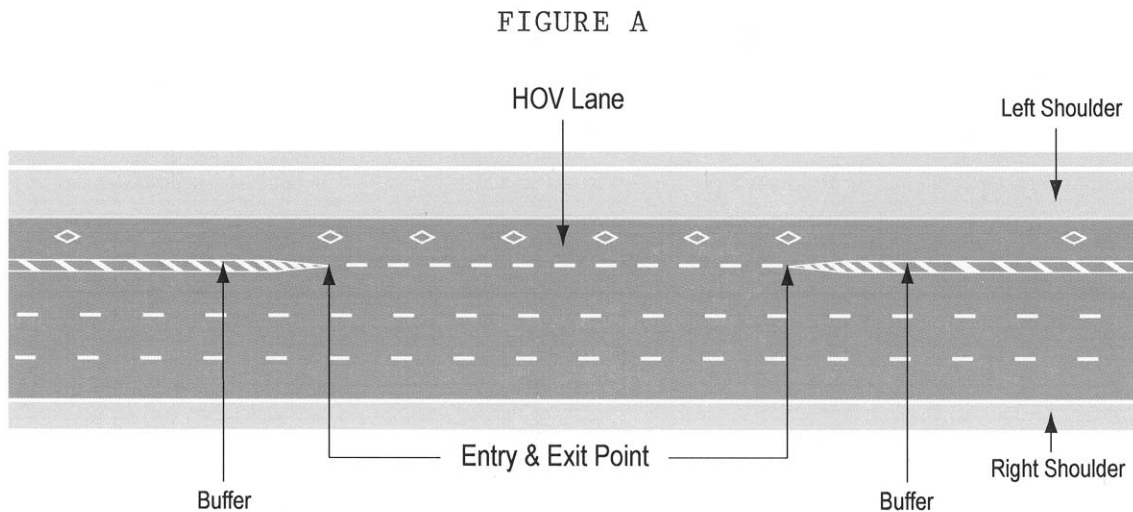
(2) No person shall operate a motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle to enter or exit a high occupancy vehicle lane by crossing a buffer zone, unless the movement can be made safely and one of the following circumstances exists:

1. A police officer directs the person to make the movement.
2. The person is operating an emergency vehicle, as defined in section 144 of the Act, in the performance of his or her duties.
3. The person is operating the vehicle in the lawful performance of his or her duties as a police officer.
4. The person is operating a vehicle owned or leased by the Province of Ontario in the lawful performance of his or her duties as an officer appointed for carrying out the provisions of the Act.
5. The person is operating a vehicle engaged in road construction or maintenance activities in or near the high occupancy vehicle lane.
6. The person is operating a tow truck that has been requested to provide towing or repair services to a disabled vehicle in or near a high occupancy vehicle lane by a police officer, an officer appointed for carrying out the provisions of the Act, or a person driving the disabled vehicle, and crossing the buffer zone is necessary to attend at and depart from the location of the disabled vehicle.
7. The person is complying with the requirements of section 159 or 159.1 of the Act.

(3) Subsection 148 (2) of the Act does not apply to a person operating a vehicle in a high occupancy vehicle lane.

Roadway markings

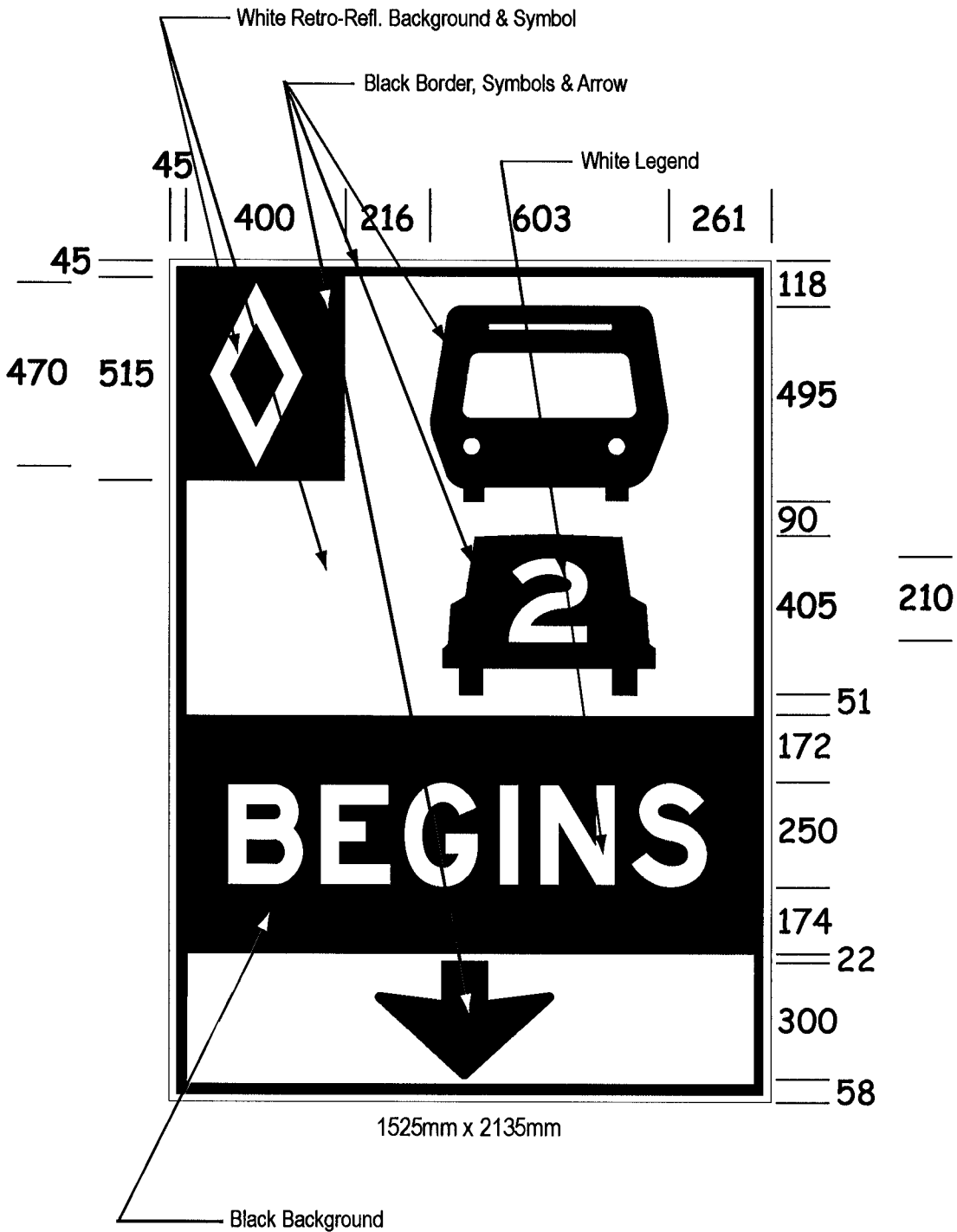
4. A high occupancy vehicle lane shall have the following roadway markings, as illustrated in Figure A:
 1. Painted white diamond markings on the surface of the roadway of the high occupancy vehicle lane, placed periodically along the length of the lane.
 2. Painted white buffer zone markings on the surface of the roadway separating high occupancy vehicle lanes from other highway lanes.
 3. Painted white continuity lane markings on the surface of the roadway between buffer zones indicating points at which vehicles may enter or exit a high occupancy vehicle lane.

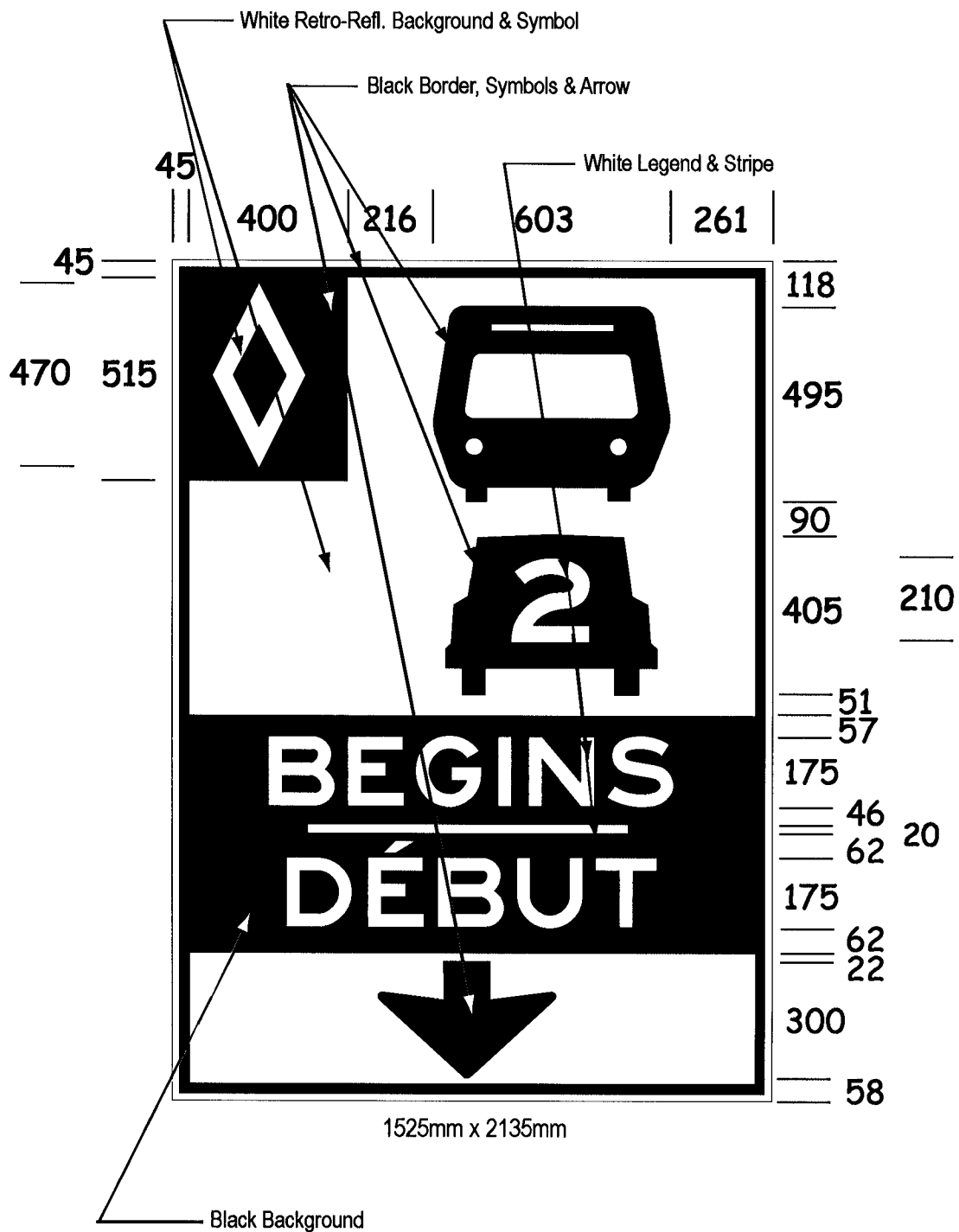
5. (1) The commencement of a high occupancy vehicle lane shall be indicated by an overhead sign that has the dimensions and bears the markings as illustrated in Figure B.

(1) That part of the King's Highway known as No. 404 (southbound) lying between a point situate 1,100 metres measured southerly from its intersection with the centre line of the roadway known as 16th Avenue in The Regional Municipality of York, and a point 1,090 metres measured southerly from its intersection with the centre line of the roadway known as Sheppard Avenue in the City of Toronto.

(2) This designation is effective 24 hours a day, seven days a week and every month of the year.

SCHEDULE B
HIGHWAY NO. 403

1. (1) That part of the King's Highway known as No. 403 (eastbound) in the City of Mississauga in The Regional Municipality of Peel lying between a point situate 886 metres measured westerly from its intersection with the centre line of the roadway known as Winston Churchill Boulevard, and a point situate 30 metres measured southerly from its intersection with the centre line of the roadway known as Matheson Boulevard.

(2) That part of the King's Highway known as No. 403 (westbound) in the City of Mississauga in The Regional Municipality of Peel lying between a point situate 150 metres measured easterly from its intersection with the centre line of the roadway known as Matheson Boulevard, and a point situate 520 metres measured easterly from its intersection with the centre line of the roadway known as Winston Churchill Boulevard.

(3) This designation is effective 24 hours a day, seven days a week and every month of the year.
