His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province entered the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and took his seat upon the Throne.

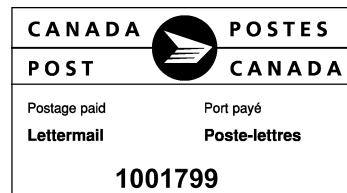

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INTERPRETATION

Interpretation

1. (1) In this Regulation,

“bond forward agreement” means a financial agreement described in section 2;

“commodity” means, whether in the original or a processed state, an agricultural product, a forest product, a product of the sea, a mineral, a metal, a hydrocarbon fuel, electricity, a precious stone or other gem and other physical goods but does not include chattel paper, a document of title, an instrument, money or securities;

“commodity price hedging agreement” means a financial agreement described in section 5;

“lease financing agreement” means a financial agreement described in section 8.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation, a lease financing agreement has a material impact on a municipality if the costs or risks associated with the agreement significantly affect the municipality’s debt and financial limit determined in accordance with Ontario Regulation 403/02 (Debt and Financial Obligation Limits) made under the Act, or would reasonably be expected to have a significant effect on that limit.

BOND FORWARD AGREEMENTS

Bond forward agreements

2. (1) A municipality that has passed a by-law authorizing the issue or refinancing of debentures denominated in Canadian currency may enter a bond forward agreement in order to minimize the cost or risk associated with the debentures because of fluctuations in interest rates.

- (2) A bond forward agreement shall provide for the following matters:

1. Borrowing and selling one or more debt instruments issued by the Government of Canada or the Province of Ontario (“government debt instruments”).
2. Buying back the government debt instruments.

3. Specifying a settlement day, which is a specified future date or the date on which a specified future event occurs.
 4. Requiring a settlement payment to be payable on the settlement day if there is a difference between the price at which the government debt instruments are sold as described in paragraph 1 and the price at which they are bought back as described in paragraph 2.
 5. Specifying that delivery of a document evidencing the government debt instrument is not required under the agreement.
- (3) A municipality shall not enter a bond forward agreement if the total value of the principal of the government debt instruments borrowed and sold as described in paragraph 1 of subsection (2) exceeds the total value of the principal of the debentures whose cost or risk the agreement is intended to minimize.
- (4) A municipality that enters a bond forward agreement shall monitor the value of the government debt instruments described in paragraph 1 of subsection (2) on each business day after the agreement is executed and before the settlement day described in paragraph 3 of subsection (1), but the municipality shall not obtain the information about the value of the instruments from any person who has a financial interest in the agreement or in the instruments.
- (5) A municipality shall not enter a bond forward agreement under which the settlement day described in paragraph 3 of subsection (2) is 60 days or more after the day on which the agreement is executed.
- (6) A municipality shall not enter a bond forward agreement under which the settlement payment exceeds the difference in price described in paragraph 4 of subsection (2).
- (7) A municipality shall not enter a bond forward agreement except with a bank listed in Schedule I, II or III to the *Bank Act* (Canada) and only if the bank's long-term debt obligations on the day the agreement is entered are rated,
- (a) by Dominion Bond Rating Service as "A(high)" or higher;
 - (b) by Fitch Ratings as "A+" or higher;
 - (c) by Moody's Investors Service Inc. as "A1" or higher; or
 - (d) by Standard and Poor's as "A+" or higher.
- (8) A municipality shall not sell or lend a bond forward agreement.
- (9) If the bond forward agreement relates to debentures to be issued or refinanced for the purposes of another municipality, the interested municipalities may enter one or more agreements relating to the costs of the bond forward agreement and relating to other matters arising from the bond forward agreement.
- (10) A municipality shall not use the proceeds from a bond forward agreement except for the following purposes:
1. To pay the interest or repay the principal of the debentures to which the agreement relates.
 2. For any purpose for which the debentures were issued.
 3. To pay the interest or repay the principal of any outstanding temporary borrowing made under section 405 or 406 of the Act in connection with the debentures.
 4. To pay the interest or repay the principal of any other outstanding borrowing by the municipality for a capital expenditure.

Statement of policies and goals re bond forward agreements

3. (1) Before a municipality passes a by-law authorizing a bond forward agreement, the council of the municipality shall adopt a statement of policies and goals relating to the use of bond forward agreements.
- (2) The council of the municipality shall consider the following matters when preparing the statement of policies and goals:
1. The types of projects for which bond forward agreements are appropriate.
 2. The fixed costs and estimated costs to the municipality resulting from the use of such agreements.
 3. A detailed estimate of the expected results of using such agreements.
 4. Risk control measures relating to such agreements, such as,
 - i. credit exposure limits based on credit ratings and on the degree of regulatory oversight and the regulatory capital of the other party to the agreement,
 - ii. standard agreements, and
 - iii. ongoing monitoring with respect to the agreements.
 5. The financial and other risks to the municipality that would exist with, and without, the use of such agreements.

Report on bond forward agreements

4. (1) If a municipality has entered any bond forward agreements in a fiscal year, the treasurer of the municipality shall prepare and present to the municipal council once in that fiscal year, or more frequently if the council so desires, a detailed report on all of those agreements.

(2) The report must contain the following information and documents:

1. A statement comparing the expected and actual results of using bond forward agreements during the period of the report.
2. A statement by the treasurer indicating whether, in his or her opinion, all of the bond forward agreements entered during the period of the report are consistent with the municipality's statement of policies and goals relating to the use of bond forward agreements.
3. Such other information as the council may require.
4. Such other information as the treasurer considers appropriate to include in the report.

COMMODITY PRICE HEDGING AGREEMENTS

Commodity price hedging agreements

5. (1) A municipality that has entered, or plans to enter, an agreement under Part II of the Act for the supply of a commodity required for a municipal system may enter into one or more financial agreements to minimize the cost or financial risk associated with incurring debt for the commodity.

(2) The financial agreement must fix, directly or indirectly, or enable the municipality to fix the price or range of prices to be paid by the municipality for the future delivery of some or all of the commodity or the future cost to the municipality of an equivalent quantity of the commodity.

(3) Subject to subsection (4), the municipality shall not sell or otherwise dispose of the financial agreement or any interest of the municipality in the agreement.

(4) The municipality may sell or otherwise dispose of a financial agreement or an interest of the municipality in the agreement if, in the opinion of the treasurer of the municipality, the sale or disposition is in the best interests of the municipality and if either of the following conditions is satisfied:

1. The sale or disposition is part of a transaction for the sale of real property by the municipality relating to a change in the use of the property by the municipality.
2. The municipality has ceased to carry on any activity relating to the municipal system for which the commodity was being acquired.

Statement of policies and goals re commodity price hedging agreements

6. (1) Before a municipality passes a by-law authorizing a commodity price hedging agreement, the council of the municipality shall adopt a statement of policies and goals relating to the use of financial agreements to address commodity pricing and costs.

(2) The council of the municipality shall consider the following matters when preparing the statement of policies and goals:

1. The types of projects for which commodity price hedging agreements are appropriate.
2. The fixed costs and estimated costs to the municipality resulting from the use of such agreements.
3. Whether the future price or cost to the municipality of the applicable commodities will be lower or more stable than they would be without the agreements.
4. A detailed estimate of the expected results of using such agreements.
5. The financial and other risks to the municipality that would exist with, and without, the use of such agreements.
6. Risk control measures relating to such agreements, such as,
 - i. credit exposure limits based on credit ratings and on the degree of regulatory oversight and the regulatory capital of the other party to the agreement,
 - ii. standard agreements, and
 - iii. ongoing monitoring with respect to the agreements.

Report on commodity price hedging agreements

7. (1) If a municipality has any subsisting commodity price hedging agreements in a fiscal year, the treasurer of the municipality shall prepare and present to the municipal council once in that fiscal year, or more frequently if the council so desires, a detailed report on all of those agreements.

- (2) The report must contain the following information and documents:
1. A statement about the status of the agreements during the period of the report, including a comparison of the expected and actual results of using the agreements.
 2. A statement by the treasurer indicating whether, in his or her opinion, all of the agreements entered during the period of the report are consistent with the municipality's statement of policies and goals relating to the use of financial agreements to address commodity pricing and costs.
 3. Such other information as the council may require.
 4. Such other information as the treasurer considers appropriate to include in the report.

LEASE FINANCING AGREEMENTS

Lease financing agreements

8. (1) In order to finance a capital undertaking, a municipality may enter into one or more lease financing agreements that require, or may require, the municipality to make payments after the expiry of the term for which the council authorizing the agreement was elected.

(2) A lease financing agreement must include a schedule of all fixed payments, if any, required by the agreement and that may be required by any extension or renewal of the agreement.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation, an agreement authorized by section 110 of the Act shall be deemed not to constitute a lease financing agreement.

Statement of policies and goals re lease financing agreements

9. (1) Before a municipality passes a by-law authorizing a lease financing agreement, the council of the municipality shall adopt a statement of policies and goals relating to the use of lease financing agreements.

(2) The statement of policies and goals,

- (a) must include a discussion of the financial and other risks to the municipality of using lease financing agreements; and
- (b) may provide for a category of lease financing agreements composed of agreements which, in the opinion of both the council of the municipality and the treasurer, would not result in a material impact for the municipality.

Advice to council re lease financing agreements

10. (1) Before a municipality enters into a lease financing agreement, the municipality shall,

- (a) have its treasurer prepare a report with a recommendation, assessing, in the opinion of the treasurer, the costs and financial and other risks associated with the proposed agreement, including,
 - (i) a comparison between the fixed and estimated costs and the risks associated with the proposed agreement and those associated with other methods of financing,
 - (ii) a statement summarizing, as may be applicable, the effective rate or rates of financing for the agreement, the ability for agreement payment amounts to vary, and the methods or calculations, including possible financing rate changes, that may be used to establish that variance under the agreement,
 - (iii) a statement summarizing any contingent payment obligations under the agreement that in the opinion of the treasurer would result in a material impact for the municipality, including agreement termination provisions, equipment loss, equipment replacement options and guarantees and indemnities,
 - (iv) a summary of the assumptions applicable to any possible variations in the agreement payment and contingent payment obligations, and
 - (v) any other matters the treasurer or council considers advisable;
- (b) obtain legal advice and financial advice with respect to the proposed agreement;
- (c) consider if the scope of the proposed transaction warrants obtaining legal advice or financial advice with respect to the proposed agreement that is from a source independent of the source of the advice mentioned in clause (b);
- (d) advise in writing the regional municipality of which it forms a part of the proposed agreement before the agreement is entered into, in the case of a lower-tier municipality; and
- (e) consider and give its assessment of the report prepared under clause (a), including whether, in its opinion, the costs of financing for the proposed agreement are lower than other methods of financing available to the municipality, and whether the risks associated with the proposed agreement are reasonable.

(2) The costs and risks associated with a proposed lease financing agreement in a report made under subsection (1) shall be assessed as of the date the report is made.

(3) At any time after a report under subsection (1) is made, but before the proposed lease financing agreement is entered into, if the treasurer becomes of the opinion that a changed circumstance with respect to the proposed agreement may result in a material impact for the municipality, the treasurer shall as soon as is reasonably possible update the report and present the updated report to the council.

(4) A report made under subsection (1) shall summarize the information required by that subsection for the entire term of the proposed lease financing agreement, including any possible extensions or renewals.

(5) Despite this section, a municipality may enter into a lease financing agreement without complying with the requirements of subsection (1) if,

(a) the statement of policies and goals for lease financing agreements includes the category referred to in clause 9 (2) (b); and

(b) in the opinion of the treasurer and the council, the proposed agreement is within that category, and its costs and risks, in combination with all the others agreements of that category entered into or proposed to be entered into in that year by the municipality, would not result in a material impact for the community.

(6) In this section,

“costs” includes the costs of any advice obtained under clause (1) (b) or (c).

Report on lease financing agreements

11. (1) If a municipality has one or more lease financing agreements subsisting in a fiscal year, the treasurer of the municipality shall prepare and present to council of the municipality once in that fiscal year, or more often if the council so desires, a detailed report containing the information described in subsection (2).

(2) The detailed report mentioned in subsection (1) shall contain,

(a) a description of the estimated proportion of the total financing arrangements of the municipality that is undertaken through lease financing agreements to the total long-term debt of the municipality and a description of the change, if any, in that estimated proportion since the previous year's report;

(b) a statement by the treasurer as to whether, in his or her opinion, all lease financing agreements were made in accordance with the statement of leasing policies and goals adopted by the municipality; and

(c) any other information that the council may require or that, in the opinion of the treasurer, should be recorded.

1. Only the proceeds of the sale by the City of its securities in a corporation incorporated under section 142 of the *Electricity Act, 1998* are used to make the investments.
2. The investments are made in a professionally-managed fund.
3. The terms of the investments provide that,
 - i. where the investment is in debt instruments, the principal must be repaid no earlier than seven years after the date on which the City makes the investment, and
 - ii. where the investment is in shares, an amount equal to the principal amount of the investment cannot be withdrawn from the fund for at least seven years after the date on which the City makes the investment.
4. The City establishes and uses a separate reserve fund for the investments.
5. Subject to paragraph 6, the money in the reserve fund, including any returns on the investments or proceeds from their disposition, are used to pay capital costs of the City and for no other purpose.
6. The City may borrow money from the reserve fund but must repay it plus interest.

(4) Subsection 4.1 (2) of the Regulation is amended by striking out "The investment under clause (b)" at the beginning in the portion before clause (a) and substituting "The investment made under clause (1) (b) or described in subsection (1.1), as the case may be".

5. Subsection 7 (3) of the Regulation is revoked.

6. Clause 8 (2) (c) of the Regulation is amended by striking out "all investments were made in accordance with" and substituting "all investments are consistent with".

7. The Regulation is amended by adding the following section:

8.1 If an investment made by the municipality is, in the treasurer's opinion, not consistent with the investment policies and goals adopted by the municipality, the treasurer shall report the inconsistency to the council of the municipality within 30 days after becoming aware of it.

8. Subsection 9 (1) of the Regulation is amended by adding the following clause:

(b.1) by Fitch Ratings as "AA-" or higher;

9. The Regulation is amended by adding the following sections:

FORWARD RATE AGREEMENTS

10. (1) A municipality that enters into an agreement to make an investment on a future date in a security prescribed by section 2 may enter one or more forward rate agreements with a bank listed in Schedule I, II or III to the *Bank Act* (Canada) in order to minimize the cost or risk associated with the investment because of fluctuations in interest rates.

(2) A forward rate agreement shall provide for the following matters:

1. Specifying a forward amount, which is the principal amount of the investment or that portion of the principal amount to which the agreement relates.
2. Specifying a settlement day, which is a specified future date.
3. Specifying a forward rate of interest, which is a notional rate of interest applicable on the settlement day.
4. Specifying a reference rate of interest, which is the market rate of interest payable on a specified future date on an acceptance issued by a bank listed in Schedule I, II or III to the *Bank Act* (Canada).
5. Requiring a settlement payment to be payable on the settlement day if the forward rate and the reference rate of interest are different.

(3) A municipality shall not enter a forward rate agreement if the forward amount described in paragraph 1 of subsection (2) for the investment whose cost or risk the agreement is intended to minimize, when added to all forward amounts under other forward rate agreements, if any, relating to the same investment, would exceed the total amount of the principal of the investment.

(4) A municipality shall not enter a forward rate agreement unless the settlement day under the agreement is within 12 months of the day on which the agreement is executed.

(5) A municipality shall not enter a forward rate agreement if the settlement payment described in paragraph 5 of subsection (2) exceeds the difference between the amount of interest that would be payable on the forward amount calculated at the forward rate of interest for the period for which the investment was made and the amount that would be payable calculated at the reference rate of interest.

(6) A municipality shall not enter a forward rate agreement except with a bank listed in Schedule I, II or III to the *Bank Act* (Canada) and only if the bank's long-term debt obligations on the day the agreement is entered are rated,

- (a) by Dominion Bond Rating Service as "A(high)" or higher;
- (b) by Fitch Ratings as "A+" or higher;
- (c) by Moody's Investors Service Inc. as "A1" or higher; or
- (d) by Standard and Poor's as "A+" or higher.

11. (1) Before a municipality passes a by-law authorizing a forward rate agreement, the council of the municipality shall adopt a statement of policies and goals relating to the use of forward rate agreements.

(2) The council of the municipality shall consider the following matters when preparing the statement of policies and goals:

1. The types of investments for which forward rate agreements are appropriate.
2. The fixed costs and estimated costs to the municipality resulting from the use of such agreements.
3. A detailed estimate of the expected results of using such agreements.
4. The financial and other risks to the municipality that would exist with, and without, the use of such agreements.
5. Risk control measures relating to such agreements, such as,
 - i. credit exposure limits based on credit ratings and on the degree of regulatory oversight and the regulatory capital of the other party to the agreement,
 - ii. standard agreements, and
 - iii. ongoing monitoring with respect to the agreements.

12. (1) If a municipality has any subsisting forward rate agreements in a fiscal year, the treasurer of the municipality shall prepare and present to the municipal council once in that fiscal year, or more frequently if the council so desires, a detailed report on all of those agreements.

(2) The report must contain the following information and documents:

1. A statement about the status of the forward rate agreements during the period of the report, including a comparison of the expected and actual results of using the agreements.

2. A statement by the treasurer indicating whether, in his or her opinion, all of the forward rate agreements entered during the period of the report are consistent with the municipality's statement of policies and goals relating to the use of forward rate agreements.
3. Such other information as the council may require.
4. Such other information as the treasurer considers appropriate to include in the report.

ASSESSMENT OF THE MANAGED FORESTS PROPERTY CLASS AND RELATED LAND

DETERMINATION OF CURRENT VALUE

32.1 (1) The current value of land in the managed forests property class shall be determined as follows for the 2006 and subsequent taxation years:

1. Determine the value of the land in accordance with subsection 19 (5.2) of the Act.
 2. Determine the value of the land in accordance with subsection (2).
 3. If the value determined under paragraph 1 is less than the value determined under paragraph 2, the current value of the land is the value determined under paragraph 1.
 4. If the value determined under paragraph 2 is less than 31 per cent of the value determined under paragraph 1, the current value of the land is the amount calculated by multiplying the value determined under paragraph 1 by 0.31.
 5. In any other case, the current value of the land is the value determined under paragraph 2.
- (2) For the purposes of paragraph 2 of subsection (1), the value of the land is determined as follows:
1. Determine whether the municipality or locality in which the land is located is listed in Column 2 of Table 1 to Part IX.1 of this Regulation. If it is, take the step described in paragraph 2. If it is not, take the steps described in paragraphs 4 and 5.
 2. If the municipality or locality is listed in Column 2 of Table 1, determine whether the land band for the land, as assigned by the assessment corporation, is listed in Column 3 of Table 1 for the applicable municipality or locality. If it is, take the steps described in paragraphs 3 and 5. If it is not, take the steps described in paragraphs 4 and 5.
 3. For land located in a municipality or locality listed in Column 2 of Table 1 and assigned to a land band listed in Column 3 of Table 1, identify the applicable value per acre of the land as set out in Column 4 of Table 1.
 4. For any other land, identify the applicable value per acre of the land as set out in Column 2 of Table 2 to Part IX.1 of this Regulation using the land band assigned to the land by the assessment corporation.
 5. The value of the land is calculated by multiplying the applicable value per acre of the land by the acreage.
- (3) In this section,

“land band” means a geographic area in which similar farm properties sell for similar prices, as determined by the assessment corporation under subsection 19 (5) of the Act.

CURRENT VALUE WHERE PARCEL CONTAINS LAND IN BOTH MANAGED FORESTS AND ANOTHER PROPERTY CLASS

32.2 (1) This section applies if a parcel of land contains both land in the managed forests property class and land in another property class.

(2) The current value of the land shall be determined as follows for the 2006 and subsequent taxation years:

1. Determine the current value of the land in the managed forests property class under subsection 19 (5.2) of the Act.
2. Determine the current value of the land in the managed forests property class under section 32.1 of this Regulation.
3. Subtract the amount determined under paragraph 2 from the amount determined under paragraph 1. If the amount determined under paragraph 2 is greater than the amount determined under paragraph 1, the amount calculated under this paragraph is deemed to be zero.
4. Subtract the amount calculated under paragraph 3 from the current value of the entire parcel of land.
5. The amount calculated under paragraph 4 is the current value of the land.

Definitions

1. In this Regulation,

“family member” means, in relation to a shareholder of a health profession corporation, the shareholder's spouse, child or parent;

“dentist corporation” means a health profession corporation that holds a certificate of authorization issued by the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario under the *Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991* or under Schedule 2 to that Act;

“physician corporation” means a health profession corporation that holds a certificate of authorization issued by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario under the *Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991* or under Schedule 2 to that Act;

“voting dentist shareholder” means, in relation to a dentist corporation, a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario who owns voting shares of the corporation;

“voting physician shareholder” means, in relation to a physician corporation, a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario who owns voting shares of the corporation.

Physician corporations

2. (1) A physician corporation is exempt from the application of paragraph 1 of subsection 3.2 (2) of the Act and, in lieu of that paragraph, the following rules apply:

1. Each issued and outstanding voting share of the corporation shall be legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
2. Each issued and outstanding non-voting share of the corporation shall be owned in one of the following ways:
 - i. It shall be legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
 - ii. It shall be legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a family member of a voting physician shareholder.
 - iii. It shall be owned legally by one or more individuals, as trustees, in trust for one or more children of a voting physician shareholder who are minors, as beneficiaries.

(2) A physician corporation and its directors and officers are exempt from the application of paragraph 2 of subsection 3.2 (2) of the Act and, in lieu of that paragraph, the following rule applies:

1. All officers and directors of the corporation shall be shareholders of the corporation who are members of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

(3) A physician corporation is exempt from the application of subsection 3.2 (4) of the Act and, in lieu of that subsection, the following rule applies:

1. An agreement or proxy that vests the right to vote the rights attached to a voting share of a physician corporation in a person other than a shareholder of the corporation who is a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario is void.

(4) A physician corporation and its shareholders are exempt from the application of subsection 3.2 (5) of the Act and, in lieu of that subsection, the following rule applies:

1. A unanimous shareholder agreement in respect of a physician corporation is void unless each voting shareholder of the corporation is a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario and each non-voting shareholder of the corporation is,
 - i. a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario,
 - ii. a family member of a voting physician shareholder, or
 - iii. a trustee under a trust described in subparagraph 2 iii of subsection 2 (1).

(5) A non-voting shareholder of a physician corporation who is not a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario is exempt from the application of subsections 3.4 (2), (4) and (6) of the Act.

(6) A physician corporation, its shareholders and its directors and officers are exempt from the application of subsection 108 (5) of the Act and, in lieu of that subsection, the following rule applies:

1. A shareholder of a physician corporation who is a party to a unanimous shareholder agreement in respect of the corporation and who is a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario has all the rights, powers, duties and liabilities, whether arising under this Act or otherwise, of a director of the corporation to the extent that the agreement restricts the discretion or powers of the directors to manage or supervise the management of the business and affairs of the corporation, and the directors are thereby relieved of their duties and liabilities, including any liabilities under section 131 of the Act, to the same extent.

Dentist corporations

3. (1) A dentist corporation is exempt from the application of paragraph 1 of subsection 3.2 (2) of the Act and, in lieu of that paragraph, the following rules apply:

1. Each issued and outstanding voting share of the corporation shall be legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario.
2. Each issued and outstanding non-voting share of the corporation shall be owned in one of the following ways:
 - i. It shall be legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario.
 - ii. It shall be legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a family member of a voting dentist shareholder.

- iii. It shall be owned legally by one or more individuals, as trustees, in trust for one or more children of a voting dentist shareholder who are minors, as beneficiaries.
- (2) A dentist corporation and its directors and officers are exempt from the application of paragraph 2 of subsection 3.2 (2) of the Act and, in lieu of that paragraph, the following rule applies:
- 1. All officers and directors of the corporation shall be shareholders of the corporation who are members of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario.
- (3) A dentist corporation is exempt from the application of subsection 3.2 (4) of the Act and, in lieu of that subsection, the following rule applies:
- 1. An agreement or proxy that vests the right to vote the rights attached to a voting share of a dentist corporation in a person other than a shareholder of the corporation who is a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario is void.
- (4) A dentist corporation and its shareholders are exempt from the application of subsection 3.2 (5) of the Act and, in lieu of that subsection, the following rule applies:
- 1. A unanimous shareholder agreement in respect of a dentist corporation is void unless each voting shareholder of the corporation is a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario and each non-voting shareholder of the corporation is,
 - i. a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario,
 - ii. a family member of a voting dentist shareholder, or
 - iii. a trustee under a trust described in subparagraph 2 iii of subsection 3 (1).
- (5) A non-voting shareholder of a dentist corporation who is not a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario is exempt from the application of subsections 3.4 (2), (4) and (6) of the Act.
- (6) A dentist corporation, its shareholders and its directors and officers are exempt from the application of subsection 108 (5) of the Act and, in lieu of that subsection, the following rule applies:
- 1. A shareholder of a dentist corporation who is a party to a unanimous shareholder agreement in respect of the corporation and who is a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario has all the rights, powers, duties and liabilities, whether arising under this Act or otherwise, of a director of the corporation to the extent that the agreement restricts the discretion or powers of the directors to manage or supervise the management of the business and affairs of the corporation, and the directors are thereby relieved of their duties and liabilities, including any liabilities under section 131 of the Act, to the same extent.

0.1 In this Regulation,

“spouse” means, in relation to a shareholder, a person to whom the shareholder is married or with whom the shareholder is living in a conjugal relationship outside marriage;

“voting dentist shareholder” means, in relation to a corporation, a member of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario who owns voting shares of the corporation;

“voting physician shareholder” means, in relation to a corporation, a member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario who owns voting shares of the corporation.

2. (1) Paragraph 2 of subsection 1 (1) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:

2. In the case of a certificate of authorization issued by a College other than the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario or the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, all of the issued and outstanding shares of the corporation are legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by one or more members of the issuing College.

2.1 In the case of a certificate of authorization issued by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, each issued and outstanding voting share of the corporation is legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the College and each issued and outstanding non-voting share of the corporation is owned in one of the following ways:

i. It is legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the College.

ii. It is legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a family member of a voting physician shareholder.

iii. It is owned legally by one or more individuals, as trustees, in trust for one or more children of a voting physician shareholder who are minors, as beneficiaries.

2.2 In the case of a certificate of authorization issued by the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, each issued and outstanding voting share of the corporation is legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the College and each issued and outstanding non-voting share of the corporation is owned in one of the following ways:

i. It is legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a member of the College.

ii. It is legally and beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, by a family member of a voting dentist shareholder.

iii. It is owned legally by one or more individuals, as trustees, in trust for one or more children of a voting dentist shareholder who are minors, as beneficiaries.

(2) Subsections 1 (3) and (4) of the Regulation are revoked and the following substituted:

(3) The name of the corporation must include the surname of one or more shareholders of the corporation who are members of the College, as the surname is set out in the College register, and may also include the shareholder’s given name, one or more of the shareholder’s initials or a combination of his or her given name and initials.

(4) The name of the corporation must indicate the health profession to be practised by members of the College through the corporation.

3. (1) Subparagraph 6 i of subsection 2 (1) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:

i. that the corporation is in compliance with section 3.2 of the *Business Corporations Act*, including the regulations made under that section, as of the date the statutory declaration is executed,

(2) Paragraph 7 of subsection 2 (1) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:

7. The name of each person who is a shareholder of the corporation as of the day the application is submitted and, if the shareholder is a member of the College, his or her business address, business telephone number and registration number with the College as of that day.

4. The Regulation is amended by adding the following section:

Duty to give Registrar declaration upon shareholder change

4.1 At the time that a corporation holding a certificate of authorization issued by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario or the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario notifies the Registrar under section 85.9 of the Code of a change in the shareholders of the corporation, the corporation shall also give the Registrar the statutory declaration of a director of the corporation, executed after the change of shareholders, certifying that the corporation is in compliance with section 3.2 of the *Business Corporations Act*, including the regulations made under that section, as of the date the statutory declaration is executed.

5. (1) Subparagraph 5 i of section 5 of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:

- i. that the corporation is in compliance with section 3.2 of the *Business Corporations Act*, including the regulations made under that section, as of the date the statutory declaration is executed,

(2) Paragraph 6 of section 5 of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:

6. The name of each person who is a shareholder of the corporation as of the day the application for renewal is submitted and, if the shareholder is a member of the College, his or her business address, business telephone number and registration number with the College as of that day.

6. Subsection 6 (1) of the Regulation is amended by adding the following paragraph:

6. In the case of a corporation that holds a certificate of authorization issued by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario or the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, the corporation fails to give the Registrar a statutory declaration in accordance with section 4.1.

7. This Regulation comes into force on January 1, 2006.
