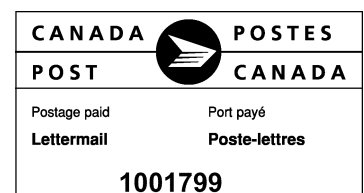

**1. (1) Clause (b) of the definition of “going concern assets” in subsection 1 (2) of Regulation 909 of the Revised Regulations of Ontario, 1990 is amended by striking out “the previously filed report” at the end and substituting “previously filed reports”.**

**(2) Clause (b) of the definition of “transfer ratio” in subsection 1 (2) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:**

- (b) the sum of,
  - (i) the solvency liabilities, and
  - (ii) the liabilities for benefits, other than pension benefits and ancillary benefits payable under qualifying annuity contracts, that were excluded in calculating the solvency liabilities; (“ratio de transfert”)

**2. (1) Paragraph 1 of subsection 4 (2.3) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:**

1.   - 1.1 The three-year period referred to in paragraph 1 must begin,
    - i. in the case of a pension plan that is not a jointly sponsored pension plan, on the valuation date, or
    - ii. in the case of a jointly sponsored pension plan, on a date not later than 12 months after the valuation date or, in the case of an inter-valuation report described in section 5.5, not later than January 1, 2007.
  - 1.2. If the valuation date of a report filed under section 3, 13 or 14 is on or after December 31, 2006 and, at the valuation date, the amount determined under clause (a) of the definition of “going concern assets” in subsection 1 (2) is not less than the going concern liabilities determined using a benefit allocation method, the present value of the required contributions for the five-year period referred to in paragraph 1.3 must not be less than the present value of the contributions for that period that would be made in respect of the normal cost for the plan if the benefit allocation method were used, after the application of any actuarial gains to reduce the normal cost in accordance with subsection 7 (3).
  - 1.3 The five-year period referred to in paragraph 1.2 must begin,
    - i. in the case of a pension plan that is not a jointly sponsored pension plan, on the valuation date, or
    - ii. in the case of a jointly sponsored pension plan, on a date not later than 12 months after the valuation date.

**(2) Paragraph 2 of subsection 4 (2.3) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:**

2. If, at the valuation date of a report filed under section 3, 13 or 14, the amount determined under clause (a) of the definition of “going concern assets” in subsection 1 (2) is less than the going concern liabilities determined using a benefit allocation method, the present value of the required contributions, which are determined under the actuarial cost method used by the plan, must not be less than the sum of the present value of the normal cost and the present value of the special payments determined in accordance with section 5 that would be required to liquidate any going concern unfunded liability determined using the benefit allocation method.

**(3) Subsection 4 (2.3) of the Regulation is amended by adding the following paragraph:**

- 2.1 The present values referred to in paragraphs 1, 1.2 and 2 shall be determined without reference to paragraphs 7 and 10 and without reference to subsections (2.7) and (2.7.1).

**(4) Paragraph 3 of subsection 4 (2.3) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:**

3. The rate or rates of interest to be used in calculating present values referred to in paragraphs 1, 1.2 and 2 shall be the rate or rates used in the report for the going concern valuation.
- 3.1 For the purposes of paragraphs 1, 1.2 and 2, the going concern valuation prepared using the benefit allocation method shall use the same rate or rates of interest as those used in the going concern valuation prepared using the actuarial cost method used by the plan.

**(5) Paragraph 4 of subsection 4 (2.3) of the Regulation is revoked and the following substituted:**

4. In the case of a pension plan that is not a jointly sponsored pension plan, the present values referred to in paragraph 2 shall be calculated using whichever of the following periods is longer:
  - i. The period that begins on the valuation date and continues until the end of the remaining amortization period of the going concern unfunded liability that has the longest remaining amortization period.
  - ii. The period of three years that begins on the valuation date.
- 4.1 In the case of a jointly sponsored pension plan, the present values referred to in paragraph 2 shall be calculated using whichever of the following periods is longer:

- i. The period that begins on a date not later than 12 months after the valuation date or, in the case of an inter-valuation report described in section 5.5, not later than January 1, 2007, and continues until the end of the remaining amortization period of the going concern unfunded liability that has the longest remaining amortization period.
- ii. The period of three years that begins on a date not later than 12 months after the valuation date or, in the case of an inter-valuation report described in section 5.5, not later than January 1, 2007.

**(6) Subparagraph 4 ii of subsection 4 (2.3) of the Regulation, as remade by subsection (5) of this section, is amended by striking out “three years” and substituting “five years”.**

For the purposes of paragraph 7, the determination of whether the required contribution rate set out in the report is higher than the required contribution rate determined in the last filed report shall be made without taking into account the ability to increase required contribution rates each year for up to three years under that paragraph, and without taking into account the ability to carry forward amounts under paragraph 10 to reduce those increases.
9. The present values referred to in subparagraph 7 ii shall be calculated using the same period as was used to calculate the present values referred to in paragraph 1, 1.2 or 2, whichever is applicable.
10. If paragraph 7 permits the required contribution rate to be increased each year for up to three years and the amount of any increase in the first or second year exceeds one third of the difference between the required contribution rate set out in the report and the required contribution rate determined in the last filed report, the excess may be carried forward to the following year or years and used to reduce the increases in the following year or years, as long as the present value of the required contributions using the increased rates, as adjusted, is not less than the present value referred to in sub-subparagraph 7 ii A or B, whichever is applicable.

(2.6) If a report filed under section 3 or 14 discloses, in respect of a jointly sponsored pension plan for which a benefit allocation method is used to set contribution rates, that an increase in the normal cost is required or that an increase is required in the amount of contributions that were previously reduced under subsection 7 (3), payment of that increase shall commence on a date not later than 12 months after the valuation date.

(2.7) If a report filed under section 3 or 14 discloses that there is a going concern unfunded liability that is required to be liquidated in respect of a jointly sponsored pension plan for which a benefit allocation method is used to set the contribution rates, the special payments in respect of the going concern unfunded liability, as determined in accordance with subsection 5 (1.2), may be increased each year for up to three years, commencing not later than 12 months after the valuation date or, in the case of an inter-valuation report described in section 5.5, not later than January 1, 2007, by at least one third of the special payments, but only if,

- (a) the special payments after that period are a level percentage of pensionable earnings for each class of members, subject to any variation that is necessary in order to take into account integration with the *Canada Pension Plan* or the *Quebec Pension Plan*; and
- (b) the present value of the special payments, including the increased special payments, over the amortization period is not less than the amount of the going concern unfunded liability.

**(13) Section 4 of the Regulation is amended by adding the following subsection:**

(2.7.1) If subsection (2.7) permits the special payments in respect of the going concern unfunded liability, as determined in accordance with subsection 5 (1.2), to be increased each year for up to three years, and the amount of any increase in the first or second year exceeds one third of the special payments, the excess may be carried forward to the following year or years and used to reduce the increases in the following year or years, as long as the present value of the special payments, including the increased special payments, as adjusted, over the amortization period is not less than the amount of the going concern unfunded liability.

    - (iii) if the certificate holder is not insured against professional liability, the requirements listed in subsection (3) be met before the certificate holder enters into an agreement to provide professional geoscientific services to any person.
- (2) The requirements referred to in clause (1) (a) and in subclause (1) (b) (i) are as follows:
1. A policy limit for each single claim of not less than \$250,000 and either an aggregate policy limit for all claims of not less than \$500,000 per year or an automatic policy reinstatement feature.
  2. Coverage for liability for errors, omissions and negligent acts arising out of the performance of all services within the practice of professional geoscience offered or provided to the public by the insured subject to such exclusions and conditions and otherwise on such terms as are consistent with normal insurance industry practice from time to time.
- (3) For the purposes of subclause (1) (b) (iii), the following requirements must be met before a certificate holder who is not insured against professional liability enters into an agreement to provide professional geoscientific services to any person:
1. The certificate holder provides to the person a copy of the certificate holder's identification and a copy of his or her certificate of authorization.
  2. The certificate holder provides the following written statement to the person:  
 The regulation respecting registration requirements under the *Professional Geoscientists Act, 2000* (Ontario Regulation 59/01 (Registration) made under the Act), requires a holder of a certificate of registration who is not insured against professional liability to inform a person with whom he or she intends to enter into an agreement for professional geoscientific services, that he or she is not so insured.  
 I, ..... (*name of certificate holder*), as the holder of a certificate of authorization issued by the Association of Professional Geoscientists of Ontario, inform you with this statement that I am not insured against professional liability.
  3. The person provides to the certificate holder a signed statement that the person has read the statement set out in paragraph 2 and acknowledges that the certificate holder is not insured against professional liability.
  4. The certificate holder provides the following to the Registrar:
    - i. The documents described in paragraph 1.
    - ii. A copy of the statements described in paragraphs 2 and 3.

## INTERPRETATION

**Definitions****1. In this Regulation,**

“Bruce Generation Station” means the generation facility located in the Municipality of Kincardine having, on the 1999 assessment roll as amended,

- (a) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-004-23401 and the legal description “CON A PT LOTS 19 TO 28, RP 3R7014 PARTS 1 TO 21, RP 3R7022 PARTS 1 TO 23”,
- (b) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-004-23403 and the legal description “CON A PT LOTS 11 TO 17 PART TP OF INVERHURON, RP 3R7016 PARTS 1 TO 5, RP 3R7021 PARTS 1 TO 15”,
- (c) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-004-23404 and the legal description “CON A PT LOTS 11 TO 24, RP 3R7017 PARTS 1 TO 43”,
- (d) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-004-23405 and the legal description “CON A PT LOTS 18 TO 23, RP 3R7018 PARTS 1 TO 6”,
- (e) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-004-23411 and the legal description “CON A PT LOTS 11 TO 21, RP 3R7015 PARTS 2 TO 6 RP 3R7026 PART 1”,
- (f) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-004-23421 and the legal description “CON A PT LOT 21, RP 3R7015 PART 1”, and

(g) assessment roll numbers beginning 41-08-260-001-17320 and the legal description “CONCESSION 4 PT LOTS A, B, C, D AND E, RP 3R7019 PARTS 1 TO 3”;

“Darlington Generation Station” means the generation facility located in the Municipality of Clarington, having assessment roll numbers beginning 18-17-010-020-09700 and the legal description “CON BF PT LOT 18 TO 24, RP 10R342, RP 10343, RP 10R398 EXP PLAN 74387, RP 10R94, RD ALLOWANCE PT, RP 10R664 PART 1 AND RP 10R1551 PART 1”, as set out on the 1999 assessment roll;

“generation facility” has the meaning assigned in subsection 2 (1) of the *Electricity Act, 1998*;

“Industrial Product Price Index” means the Industrial Product Price Index contained in Statistics Canada Catalogue Number 62-011-XPE, Statistical Tables, Table 1: Summary of Recent Price Movements, All Commodities Index;

“Pickering Generation Station” means the generation facility located in the City of Pickering, having assessment roll numbers beginning 18-01-020-022-06800 and the legal description “CON BF RANGE 2, 3 PT LOT 17-22 & PT RD ALLOW BETWEEN BF RANGE 2, 3 & PT PT RD ALLOW BETWEEN LOT 18, 19, 20, 21”, as set out on the 1999 assessment roll;

“replacement cost new” means, in respect of a building or structure, the cost of reconstructing the building or structure, as determined by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation for the assessment year in question, prior to any reduction in value associated with accumulated depreciation and obsolescence;

“water intake and discharge facilities” includes tunnels, pipes, ducts, forebays, channels, groins, retaining or revetment walls, berms, and associated structures and improvements that are related to the intake and discharge of water at the Bruce Generation Station, the Darlington Generation Station or the Pickering Generation Station.

#### PROPERTY CLASSES

##### Commercial property class

2. For 1999 and subsequent taxation years, the following are included in the commercial property class:

1. Land at the Bruce Generation Station described in Schedule 1 for assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23401, Schedule 2 for assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23403, Schedule 3 for assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23404 or Schedule 4 for assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23405 that is used in the manner described in the respective Schedule.
2. Land at the Darlington Generation Station that is used as a field office for site construction, to a maximum of 25,000 square feet.
3. Land at the Pickering Generation Station described in Schedule 5 for assessment roll number 18-01-020-022-06800 that is used as described in the manner described in that Schedule.

##### Office building property class

3. For 1999 and subsequent taxation years, the following are included in the office building property class:

1. Land at the Darlington Generation Station not included in the commercial property class that is used as a field office for site construction.
2. Land at the Pickering Generation Station that is the portion of the Engineering Services Building that is not included in the commercial property class.

##### Large industrial property class

4. For the 1999 and subsequent taxation years, land at the Darlington Generation Station described in Schedule 6 for assessment roll number 18-17-010-020-09700 that is used as described in that Schedule is included in the large industrial property class.

#### ASSESSED VALUE OF PRESCRIBED BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

##### Prescribed buildings and structures

5. (1) The following buildings and structures are prescribed for the purposes of subsection 19.0.1 (1) of the Act, effective April 1, 1999:

1. The buildings and structures at the Bruce Generation Station that are listed in Schedules 7 to 9, for assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23401, assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23403 and assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23404, respectively.
2. The buildings and structures at the Darlington Generation Station that are listed in Schedule 10 for assessment roll number 1817-010-020-09700.
3. The buildings and structures at the Pickering Generation Station that are listed in Schedule 11 for assessment roll number 1801-020-022-06800.

4. The water intake and discharge facilities at the Bruce, Darlington and Pickering Generation Stations.

(2) Despite subsection (1), no building or structure whose construction was completed after December 31, 2002 is prescribed for the purposes of subsection 19.0.1 (1) of the Act.

**Assessed value of buildings and structures in Schedules 7 to 11**

6. For the purposes of clause 19.0.1 (1) (b) of the Act, the assessed value of the buildings and structures listed in Schedules 7 to 11 shall be determined in the manner described in clause 19.0.1 (1) (a) of the Act, with the inside ground floor area of the buildings and structures calculated on the basis that the interior dimensions are equal to 95 per cent of the exterior dimensions.

**Assessed value of water intake and discharge facilities**

7. (1) For the purposes of clause 19.0.1 (1) (b) of the Act, the assessed value of the water intake and discharge facilities at the Bruce, Darlington and Pickering Generation Stations shall be determined in accordance with this section.

(2) For the 1999 to 2002 taxation years, the assessed value of the water intake and discharge facilities at the Bruce Generation Station is determined in the following manner:

1. For assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23401,
  - i. for each of the 1999 and 2000 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.118161, and
  - ii. for each of the 2001 and 2002 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.120469.
2. For assessment roll number 41-08-260-004-23403,
  - i. for each of the 1999 and 2000 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.188377, and
  - ii. for each of the 2001 and 2002 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.190332.

(3) For the 1999 to 2002 taxation years, the assessed value of the water intake and discharge facilities at the Darlington Generation Station is determined in the following manner:

1. For each of the 1999 and 2000 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.237882.
2. For each of the 2001 and 2002 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.240848.

(4) For the 1999 to 2002 taxation years, the assessed value of the water intake and discharge facilities at the Pickering Generation Station is determined in the following manner:

1. For each of the 1999 and 2000 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.376169.
2. For each of the 2001 and 2002 taxation years, the assessed value is determined by multiplying the difference between the replacement cost new of the facilities and the amount, as determined by the assessment corporation, of accumulated depreciation to the end of that year by a factor for obsolescence equal to 0.386594.

(5) For the 2003 taxation year, the assessed value of the water intake and discharge facilities at the Bruce, Darlington and Pickering Generation Stations is the same as the assessed value of the respective facilities for the 2002 taxation year.

(6) For 2004 and each subsequent taxation year, the assessed value of the water intake and discharge facilities at the Bruce, Darlington and Pickering Generation Stations is determined by multiplying the assessed value of the respective facilities for the previous taxation year by the factor determined using the formula,

$$1 + (A - B)/B$$

in which,

“A” is the Industrial Product Price Index for March of the previous taxation year, and

“B” is the Industrial Product Price Index for March of the year before the previous taxation year.
