Summary of Document

The Adaptive Management of Stream Corridors in Ontario document was prepared in partnership by the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Trent University Watershed Science Centre. This document provides a thorough background of surface water management including a review of historical and current land-use changes and their impacts on streams. It incorporates practical and scientific considerations in geomorphology, engineering, and ecological disciplines. It outlines an adaptive management framework for the management of streams in southern Ontario.

Purpose

This document is an informational and outreach resource. The target audience of the document is water resource engineers, fluvial geomorphologists, and land-use planners. Proponents may choose to consider mitigation options and management planning approaches provided in the guide when assessing methods to minimize adverse effects to species at risk and their habitat.

Approvals
